SWEET SIXTEEN

(1) Louisville over (4) Wake Forest

Seems like Louisville is destined for big things this year, doesn't it?

(3) Kansas over (10) USC

For those of you who missed yesterday's column, I went to USC; that's really the only reason anybody would have them in the Sweet Sixteen. They won't beat Kansas, though. I mean, they may not beat Boston College in Round 1. But they really won't beat Kansas.

(1) UConn over (4) Washington

I'm not really picking many upsets, am I? I suppose that's the safest way to go.

(2) Memphis over (3) Missouri

Yeah, I'm just looking at my picks in this bracket, and I've got No. 1 vs. No. 4, and No. 2 vs. No. 3. Not really going out on any limbs there. I decided I was bullish on Memphis for some reason, though, so I'm sticking to that.

(1) Pittsburgh over (5) Florida State

Spoiler alert: I think it's Pitt's year.

(2) Duke over (3) Villanova

If I had it to do over again, and if I'd have stopped to think about it (which is strictly against my own set of rules for filling out my NCAA tournament picks), this would be a good place to pick a mild upset; I don't think anybody's blown away by Duke this year. But what's done is done.

(1) North Carolina over (5) Illinois

I'm not wild about North Carolina, but they do have a player on their roster of whom I've actually heard, which if you remember yesterday's picks column is a key factor as far as I'm concerned.

(2) Oklahoma over (6) Arizona State

This particular quadrant of the bracket is just crawling with players I've heard of; Oklahoma's got one too!

GREAT EIGHT

[I know most people say "Elite Eight;" I'll never get on board with that. That term is only used because both words start with "e," but the e's don't even make the same sound. It's stupid. "Great Eight" is better, assuming we even need a term from this level of the tournament at all; since the round of eight gets underway only a few hours after the round of sixteen finishes up, I submit that we could live without one. (1) Louisville over (3) Kansas

(1) UConn over (2) Memphis
